The rules are different in every house. When I was growing up, we wore our shoes in the house. In my home today, we take our shoes off when we come inside. You can probably think of other examples of families having different rules in their homes.

Who makes the rules for our country and for the world? Who decides what is right and wrong in the U.S.? Federal, state and local governments can (and should) make laws about stealing, paying your taxes, and how to drive. But what about how you talk about people? What about your relationships with people, or if you always have to tell the truth? Who makes rules about what you can post on Facebook? Who decides what is right and what is wrong?

This month, we continue thinking about how Christians and non-Christians see the world very differently. How we see "right" and "wrong" is a very major difference.

First of all, who decides what is right and wrong? For Christians, that is an easy answer. God decides. God gave us His Law, which we see most clearly in the Ten Commandments. His Word is the authority that tells us right and wrong. If we want to know, we look to His Word.

For the non-Christian, right and wrong are very difficult ideas because they think people decide themselves what is right and what is wrong. That doesn't work very well. If I decide to have a big party with lots of people who run around in my neighbor's yard and trample his flowers, I might think that is okay but my neighbor doesn't like it. Or maybe you want to stay healthy and you wear a mask to go to the grocery store but many other people don't wear masks.

So what is right and wrong? Christians say God teaches us that, but non-Christians say they can decide themselves. For many years, maybe most of your life, non-Christians in the U.S. accepted many of God's Laws and what He said was right and wrong. But that has slowly been changing for many years. Today, more and more people say they don't want God's Law.

They want to make up their own rules. That is leading to more disagreement and conflict between Christians and non-Christians. What can Christians do about this?

I will explain three ways Christians can respond. The first way is that Christians can follow what the world says. God says sexual sin, loving money, and gossiping about people is wrong. The world says those things are fun and good. So some Christians think they can forget what God said and follow the world. Then unbelievers will like us and we can all get along better. That is wrong! Don't do that! But some churches do that. Understand, they insult God and leave Him. Christians should never give up what God says and follow the world's ways. We should NOT respond to the world this way.

The second response is a little more complicated. We can fight the world about rules and try to force all people to accept God's Law. But what good will that do? Then they will think that Christianity is a bunch of rules and nothing more. The Gospel is lost. All that will happen is a war about rules. We don't want that. But there are some places we need to stand up and speak out. When people are being hurt or the family suffers – abortion, domestic violence, racism, homosexuality, then the church needs to boldly say what God says about right and wrong. We have a responsibility to speak the truth in love. We have a responsibility to defend people and protect life and health.

The third response is one we can always do: we live the way God says. We can't control other people, but we can still do what is right. Our lives are a witness, showing what God says is right and wrong. Our actions every day will show how we love God and love other people. Our actions will show that we don't join other people in their sin. They might make fun of you because you don't sin with them (see 1 Peter 4:4), but our lives will show them that God's ways are better than their ways.

Other people will fight in Washington, D.C., and in your state capitol about who gets to make the laws and what those laws will be. We will speak up there when necessary. But the place you have the most influence is in your daily life. Don't fight to make unbelievers follow God's Law. Be an example in your life. Most important, show that we have a Savior who obeyed God's Law for us and He forgives us. Show how God made you free in Jesus, and now it is a joy for you to live as God says.

## Racism and Black Lives Matter

Everyone has seen a lot in the news recently about George Floyd, Black Lives Matter, racism, riots, and protests. Some of it is confusing and you may not know what to think. Other people have very strong opinions. What should we think? Pastor Eckert posted a vlog on this topic on our website. You can visit that to see more, but here are the main points from that post.

- 1. Recognize that people have suffered discrimination. That is wrong, and there is no reason for us to pretend it doesn't happen.
- 2. Examine yourself for sinful attitudes, wrong actions and hurtful words. Repent, receive God's forgiveness, change and do the right thing. But don't feel guilty just because someone said you are guilty. Look at God's word and see what He says about your behavior, words and attitude. Trust His forgiveness and live the new life He gives you.
- 3. When you see other people saying or doing things that hurt someone, say something. Remind them that God loves all people and we should also love all people.
- 4. The government is responsible and has the right to stop and arrest people who are breaking the law. We should support the government and police in that work. But if they go too far and harass innocent people, or they hurt people for no reason, then people have the right to protest that.
- 5. People are protesting because they want everyone to be treated equally, and that is fine. They aren't breaking any government law, and a simple protest isn't breaking God's law. But people who are fighting, destroying things, and threatening people, they are doing wrong. God wants us to protect and respect people's lives and property. Peaceful protest is okay. Causing damage is wrong and sinful.
- 6. Above all, our responsibility is to love each other as God says, especially in the church, but also in society. If people are strong, good for them, let them take care of themselves. If people are not strong, such as people who get discriminated against, people with hard lives, people who suffer, then we show mercy to them, love them, protect them, help them.

That has always been God's message in the Bible. That has always been what the true Christian church teaches and preaches. Maybe we haven't always followed that teaching very well. This is a time to remember that teaching and do it.

A word of warning about Black Lives Matter: Christians want to speak up for people who are being oppressed or abused (Proverbs 31:8-9), so that can also mean that we speak up to defend Black people and their rights. But we don't want to say "Black Lives Matter." Why not? "Black Lives Matter" is the name of an organization that is very anti-Christian. The Black Lives Matter organization hates God's teaching. We can support Black people, but we will not support Black Lives Matter.

### Answers to Dive Into God's Word

- 1. Curb the Law stops terrible sin in the <u>world</u>. The Law threatens punishment if you break the Law. People are afraid of punishment, and that stops most people from doing terrible sins.
  - Mirror the Law shows all people that we <u>sin</u>. When we look at the Law and look at our lives, we see that we break the Law, we see that we sin.
  - Guide the Law shows Christians how God wants us to <u>live</u>. The Law shows what kind of life pleases God. As Christians, we want to live the way He wants.
- 2. a. The "curb" is for all people. All people feel temptation to sin, and the Law is there to stop all people, Christians and unbelievers, from terrible sin.
- 3. a. The "mirror" is for all people, because all people need to see that they are sinners.
- 4. c. The "guide" is only for Christians. Unbelievers can't follow God's law. We can use God's Law the right way only because we live in Jesus. Because Jesus made us clean and holy, the Law can show us how to live.
- 5. The first three commandments describe our relationship with God. We honor Him above everything else, we honor His name, and we worship Him.
- 6. Jesus said we love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. When you love God with everything, then you will perfectly obey God's Law. If you don't love God with everything, then you will love and serve other things, and you will not love and serve God.
- 7. The other seven commandments describe our relationship with our neighbor. Our neighbor means everyone around us family, friends, coworkers, enemies, strangers, etc.
- 8. Jesus said we love other people the same as we love ourselves. How much do you love yourself? Love other people the same way. What things do you do to take care of yourself or be good to yourself? Do those same things for other people. That is how you love them.
- 9. Jesus said the Law and Prophets aren't going away. His word will continue as long as the earth and sky continue. Jesus also said that no one should say His word is not important or set it aside. So we can't say God's Law changes and we should follow the culture instead. God's Law is always true.
