pive Into God's Word

We are continuing in our study of people in the Bible, how God used them and how they grew in faith. March and April include Lent, Holy Week, and Easter, the time we remember and celebrate Jesus' work to save us. There is a man in the Old Testament whose life showed some of what Jesus would do. That man is Joseph. Not Jesus' father, but Joseph the son of Jacob and great-grandson of Abraham. The main part of his story is in Genesis chapters 37, 39-45. *Answers are on page 4*.

Thoughts About Billy Graham

Rev. Billy Graham passed away Feb. 21, 2018. There are many news stories about his evangelism, his attitude, character, faith, his use of radio and television, and how he preached to millions of people.

Who was Billy Graham? He was a sinner the same as the rest of us. As he grew up, he learned about Jesus' death and resurrection to forgive him and give him life. Faith in Jesus changed his life and he wanted to use his life to serve God and tell more people about Jesus. He was a Baptist and he believed some things different from what we believe. We don't agree with everything he taught, but he did teach that Jesus died to save us and faith in Jesus is the only way to heaven. He was married to his wife, Ruth, for almost 64 years. They had 5 children and 19 grandchildren.

What was his goal in life? Billy Graham once said, "My one purpose in life is to help people find a personal relationship with God, which I believe comes through knowing Christ." That is why he worked hard to preach to so many people. He wanted them to hear about Jesus and believe in Him.

Can we learn anything from him? The same as every Christian, Billy Graham did things that glorified God, and he did things that he later realized were wrong and he was sorry he did them. We don't want to make it look like he was perfect, but he was a good Christian example in several ways.

- 1. He trusted Jesus for life and worked hard to tell people about Jesus.
- 2. He was a faithful husband and father.
- 3. Many TV preachers seem to love the attention and money they get from being on TV. Billy Graham didn't want attention for himself. He was humble. He wanted people to attend to God.
- 4. He was a man of integrity. He carefully protected himself from any sin or trouble that would ruin himself, his family, or his ministry.

It would be good for all of us to pay attention like this to how we live as Christians!


Jesus Raised Alive
