Then all the disciples left him and fled. Matthew 26:56

Alone.

That's one of the worst words in the world. In the past year, a lot of people have felt alone. The normal gathering places like churches, schools, restaurants, and clubs all closed for a while. Many people had a very hard time not getting together with others. Thankfully it looks like things will continue to open up as more people get the vaccine and infection rates go down.

When you look at the story of Jesus getting arrested, judged and crucified, you see a lot about people being alone. When Peter went to the high priest's house to see what will happen to Jesus, Peter said three times that he didn't know Jesus. Then he realized what he had done. He was full of sorrow and went out crying bitterly. Alone.

Judas betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver. Maybe he thought this will make Jesus prove to the Jewish leaders that He was the Savior. We don't know what Judas was thinking. But when Judas saw that Jesus was going to die, he was very sad that he betrayed Jesus. He went out and hanged himself. Alone.

Jesus was the most alone. When He got arrested, all the disciples left Jesus and they ran away. Jesus had no one to help Him when the Jews judged Him. When the Roman governor Pontius Pilate judged Jesus, again Jesus had no one to help Him. No one to defend Him or encourage Him. When the soldiers whipped and beat Jesus, He was surrounded by enemies, no friends. When Jesus was crucified, even God the Father left Him. That is why Jesus shouted on the cross, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" He suffered judgment, the cross, and the punishment of hell for our sin. Alone.

Sometimes we feel all alone. Troubles overwhelm us. Family and friends ignore us. But we are not alone. Jesus died and rose alive again so He can live with you. He's been through suffering. He's been through hell. He's been more alone than you can imagine. But He's not alone now – He's with you! He promised He is with you always until the end of the world (Matthew 28:20).

Jesus did everything to save you. He suffering everything so He can give you hope. No matter what happens, He is always Your Savior. Remember that, trust His promises, and receive His comfort.

pive Into God's Word

These things happened to make them an example for others. These things were written down as a warning for us who are living in the closing days of history. 1 Cor. 10:11

The Bible has many examples. Some are good examples that we should follow. Some are bad examples that show what we should not do. Understand – Jesus' main job isn't to be our example! Jesus is our Savior, not our example. He doesn't show you how you can save yourself. He shows you that He saves you. But many of the stories about God's people in the Old Testament and New Testament are good examples for us to learn how we can live as God's people. We will continue to study these stories this year.

This month, we will look at revenge and forgiveness. *Answers on page 4*.

Example: Don't Get Revenge, Genesis 34:1-31

- 1. What did the man named Shechem do to Jacob's daughter named Dinah? (Gen. 34:1-2)
- 2. What did Shechem want to do next? (Gen. 34:3-4)
- 3. Jacob's sons (Dinah's brothers) were very angry at Shechem. What agreement did they make with Shechem and his father? Were they being honest? (Gen. 34:13-17)
- 4. While the men in the city were healing, what did Simeon and Levi do? (Gen. 34:25-29)
- 5. Simeon and Levi got revenge, not only against the man Shechem, but against everyone in the city. That made Jacob afraid. Why? (Gen. 34:30)

Example: Forgive, Genesis 37:23-37, 50:15-21

- 1. What did Joseph's brothers do to him? (Gen. 37:23-28)
- 2. What story did the brothers tell their father Jacob about Joseph? (Gen. 37:31-35)
- 3. When Jacob died, what were Joseph's brothers afraid of? What did they ask Joseph to do? (Gen. 50:15-17)
- 4. What did Joseph tell his brothers? Do you think that is what God wanted? (Gen. 50:19-21)

Lessons for us

- There will always be times in our life when people hurt us. You can't avoid getting hurt.
- God says we should not get revenge (Romans 12:17-21). If we get revenge, that only leads to more anger and revenge and relationships fall apart.
- God tells us to forgive the same as He forgives us (Lord's Prayer, Matt. 6:12-15). When we forgive instead of getting revenge, that shows God's love and makes it possible for relationships to heal. If a person needs to be punished, let God do that.

Answers to Dive Into God's Word, p. 2.

Don't Get Revenge, Genesis 34:1-31

- 1. Shechem raped Dinah.
- 2. Shechem wanted to marry Dinah. After the way he hurt her, why would anyone agree to let her marry him? Her father wasn't happy, and her brothers were very angry.
- 3. Dinah's brothers did not want to let her marry Shechem. They wanted revenge. So they lied and said she could marry him on one condition, that Shechem and all the men in the city had to get circumcised. But they secretly wouldn't let her get married. They only wanted the men to hurt from the circumcision.
- 4. Simeon and Levi attacked the city and killed everyone. The men were still sore from getting circumcised and they couldn't fight very well, so Simeon and Levi were successful in their attack and getting revenge for Dinah.
- 5. Only the man Shechem sinned, but Simeon and Levi killed everyone in the city. Jacob was afraid that the nearby towns would come and punish Jacob's family and kill them all. You know that if you get revenge against someone, many times they will still be angry and find a way to get revenge back at you. That is what Jacob was afraid of.

Be Patient, 1 Samuel 1:1-18

- 1. Joseph's brothers sold him as a slave. Joseph became a slave in Egypt.
- 2. They cut up Joseph's coat and dipped it in blood, then showed it to their father. They wanted him to think a wild animal attacked and killed Joseph.
- 3. Joseph's brothers were afraid Joseph will want revenge against them. So they asked Joseph to forgive them for their sin.
- 4. Joseph forgave his brothers and he promised to take care of them. Joseph said it was all God's plan to send him to Egypt. Joseph also said that he is not God, so he can't punish them. That is an important lesson for us. God will punish people who do wrong. We as individuals do not try to punish people.



I GUESS NOW I KNOW When they came to the place that God had told him about, <u>Abraham</u> built the <u>altar</u> and arranged the <u>wood</u> on it. Then he tied up his son <u>Isaac</u> and laid him on top of the wood on the altar. Next, Abraham picked up the <u>knife</u> and took it in his hand to <u>sacrifice</u> his son. But the <u>Angel</u> of the Lord called to him from <u>heaven</u> and said, "Abraham! Abraham!"

"Yes?" he answered.

"Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you did not refuse to give me your son, your only son."
