Believe the Truth

When we told you about the power and the return of our Lord Jesus Christ, we were not telling clever stories that someone had made up. But with our own eyes we saw his true greatness. 2 Peter 1:16 (CEV)

When the Roman governor was questioning Jesus, he asked, "What is truth?" That is a question many people ask today. Politicians say anything that will get them votes. Millions of people try to live in a computer world of virtual reality. People disagree over many important questions. When does life begin? Who made us?

People in this world don't know what truth is. So they also don't know if the Bible says the truth about Jesus. Did Jesus really get crucified and die? Did He really rise alive from the dead? Many people think that isn't true. They say the Bible is only a bunch of stories to make us feel good.

Don't let them confuse you! Peter wrote these words to encourage us that God's word is true. Peter and the other apostles saw Jesus themselves. They were eyewitnesses. Peter, James and John saw Jesus in His glory on the mountain when Jesus was shining bright like the sun. The disciples saw Jesus crucified, dead and buried. They also saw Jesus raised alive!

The disciples were amazed and surprised at what they saw. They also doubted because it was too amazing. But they saw the truth – Jesus crucified and raised alive – and they believed it and wrote it so that we can also believe.

Here are just a few things that help show that the Bible tells the truth about Jesus.

- The Bible shows the disciples doubted and didn't understand at first. If people make up stories, they will make themselves look good. The Bible didn't make the disciples look good, because the Bible told the truth.
- The Bible has many historical names, places, events, etc. Research has shown that the Bible didn't make these up. They are true.
- The disciples changed after Jesus rose alive. If they made up Jesus' rising alive, they would still be afraid. They were brave because Jesus was alive.

The world will continue to doubt and say that Jesus' death and resurrection isn't true. We have God's word to show us the truth, that Jesus is our living Lord and Savior. Let's share that truth with everyone!

The Table of Duties

What are the responsibilities of the government? Of citizens?

In the January/February newsletter, we began a new series on the Table of Duties. This is from Martin Luther's Small Catechism. A catechism is a teaching book to help parents teach their children the Christian faith. We also use it to teach adults who are new to the church and just starting to learn about Jesus. The Table of Duties is a part of the catechism that reminds us what our responsibilities are and how we live as pastors, church members, fathers, mothers, employees, etc. The past couple years, there has been a lot of discussion (and arguing) about the government and what their role is. We will see what God says about the government's responsibilities and also citizen responsibilities. *Answers are on p. 4*

What does this mean?

- God establishes governments. He wants people to live in good order and obey the law.
- God gives the government the responsibility to punish people who do wrong, and to reward people who do right.
- The government is not the top boss. God and His law are the top authority. Government works best when they honor God's laws and follow the laws themselves.

What does this mean?

- God wants us to obey the government. He gave them authority, so when we obey our leaders, we are also obeying and honoring God.
- Obey doesn't mean obey and complain. God tells us to respect and honor our leaders, also.
- God tells us to pray for our leaders. Paul uses four different words to describe how we pray for them (1 Tim. 2:1). The words mean we pray about very important things, we pray for other people, we pray for our leaders in church, and we thank God for them.
- What if the government tells us to do something wrong? Acts 5:29 says we must obey God and not people (if people tell us to go against God). Titus 3:1 says we should be ready to help the government with every good thing. But if the government tells us to do evil, we will not do that.

We have preached that Christ has been raised from the dead. So how can some of you say that no one rises from the dead? If no one rises from the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, what we preach doesn't mean anything. Your faith doesn't mean anything either. More than that, we would be lying about God. We are witnesses that God raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if the dead are not raised. If the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith doesn't mean anything. Your sins have not been forgiven. Those who have died believing in Christ are also lost. Do we have hope in Christ only for this life? Then people should pity us more than anyone else.

But Christ really has been raised from the dead. He is the <u>first</u> of all those who will rise from the dead. Death came because of what a man did. <u>Rising</u> from the dead also comes because of what a man did. Because of <u>Adam</u>, all people die. So because of Christ, all will be made <u>alive</u>.
