Most of the major parts of the church year go all the way back to the early church. Good Friday, Easter, and Pentecost were important to the very first Christians. Later Christians added Christmas, then Advent and Lent to prepare for Christmas and Holy Week. The Reformation happened much later, in the year 1517, but it is still an important time in the church year for Christians to remember.

Why do we celebrate Reformation Day? How is it important? You can think of it as the day we remember how God cleans us up. Have you ever had something valuable that was really, really dirty? You may have been cleaning out a loved one's attic or basement and found something precious that was old and dirty. What did you do with it? Throw it away, or clean it and keep it? Probably you cleaned it and kept it, because it was valuable or important to you.

Everybody knows October 31 is Halloween. In the Lutheran Church, we celebrate October 31 as Reformation Day. We also celebrate the next day, November 1, as All Saints' Day. The reason we celebrate those two days is related. It is all about being God's cleaned-up people.

On Reformation Day, we celebrate the good news that God freely saves us. There was a time in the church when people forgot that. They thought they had to clean themselves up, that they had to work to earn forgiveness. But we don't have to work to get salvation. We don't need to prove to God that we are good enough for heaven. God gives us salvation free.

We truly don't deserve that gift! Romans 3 says that everyone has sinned. Everyone. Not one person deserves good things from God. No one is equal to His glory. We are all sinners and we all deserve punishment. Even though we were dirty with sin, God says we are very valuable. He still loves us, and He washed us and made us clean. Reformation Day celebrates that great gift, that God sent Jesus for us even though we don't deserve it.

All Saints' Day is the celebration that we are still His clean and holy people. God saved us from sin, so we don't want to go back and live in sin any more. We are finished with the way of death and hell! But we know we do still sin. Does God continue to love us and forgive us? Yes. Jesus died to forgive all of our sins. He says we are His clean and holy children now and forever.

Remember to thank God always for His wonderful gift of life for us. We don't deserve it, but we thank Him for giving it! And we ask Him to help us live as His holy people, because that is who He made us to be.

What is Faith?

There is more about the Reformation than we are able to study, but there are three points that help us understand what the Reformation was about. Martin Luther and his friends emphasized that God gives us salvation only through the Scriptures (Bible), only by Grace, and only by Faith. Many people misunderstand what faith is, so we will look into that more and learn again what true faith is. (Answers are on p. 4)

Faith (or belief) means trusting God. Faith is depending on His promises. Believing He will do what He says He will do.
